friday april 11 5pm

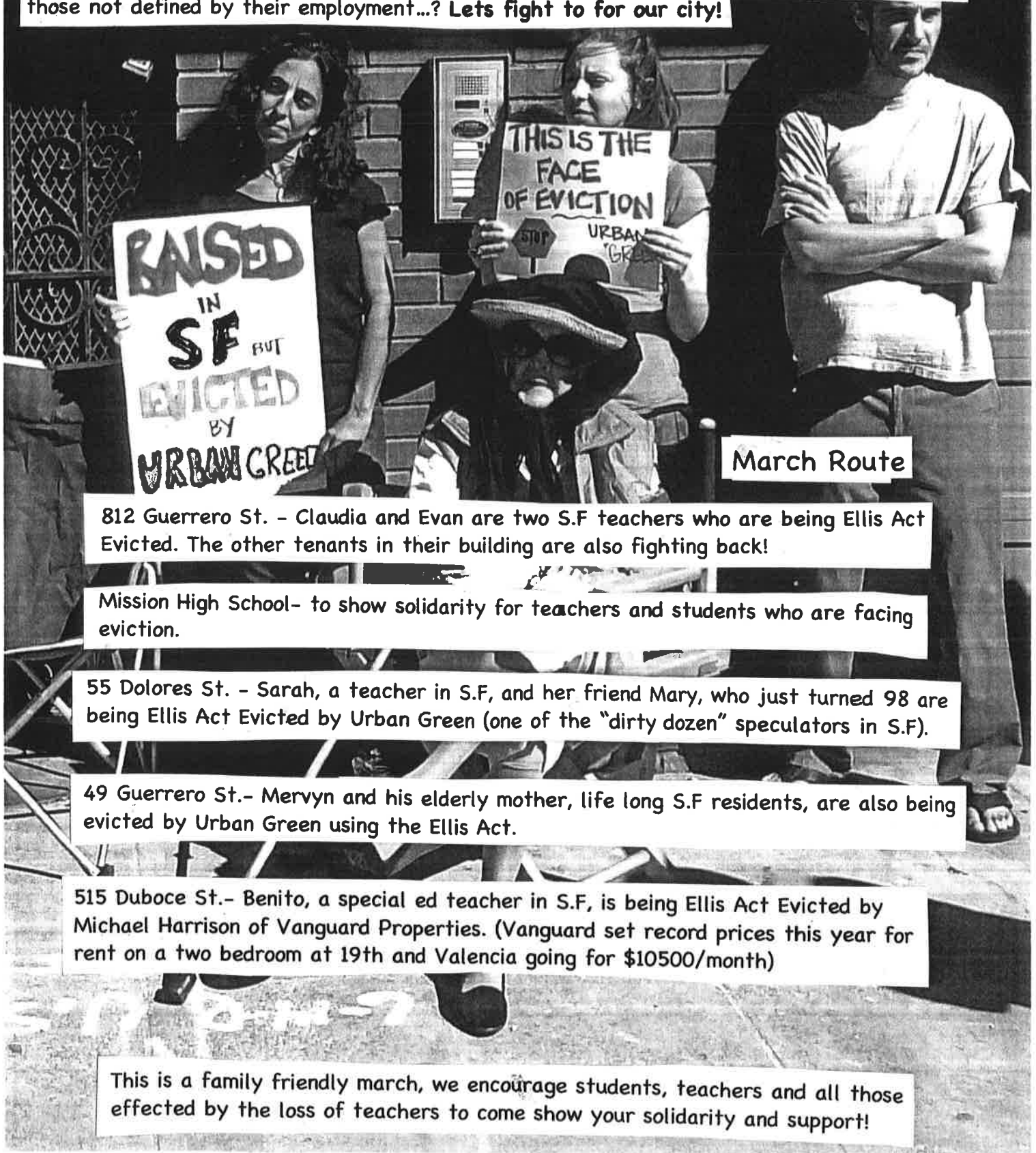
Meet at the corner of 20th and Dolores street

March Route

812 Guerrero St. - Claudia and Evan are two S.F teachers who are being Ellis Act Evicted. The other tenants in their building are also fighting back!

Mission High School- to show solidarity for teachers and students who are facing eviction.

55 Dolores St. - Sarah, a teacher in S.F, and her friend Mary, who just turned 98 are being Ellis Act Evicted by Urban Green (one of the "dirty dozen" speculators in S.F).

49 Guerrero St.- Mervyn and his elderly mother, life long S.F residents, are also being evicted by Urban Green using the Ellis Act.

515 Duboce St.- Benito, a special ed teacher in S.F, is being Ellis Act Evicted by Michael Harrison of Vanguard Properties. (Vanguard set record prices this year for rent on a two bedroom at 19th and Valencia going for \$10500/month)
